Utility Rate Increases

At the November 2018 Council meeting 2 new ordinances were passed that set new rates for both the Sewer & Water Utilities. Small increases will be added each year from 2019 to 2029. These increases were needed to keep our system up to date and running properly.

- Effective 1/1/19 the Sewer Rate will increase to \$67 per quarter. For anyone living outside the village with Sewer the new rate will be \$100.50 per quarter.
- Effective 1/1/19 the Water Rate will increase to \$29 per quarter for the first 8,000 gallons then each additional 1000 gallons will be \$2.10. For those living outside the Village with water the new quarterly rate will be \$43.50 for the first 8,000 gallons then \$3.15 for each additional 1000 gallons. Late fees remain the same. Bulk water sales are also increasing to \$10 per 1000 gallons.
- These rates will be reflected on the utility bill you receive around 4/1/19.
- Trash Rate will increase effective 4/1/19 to \$34.77 for Regular and \$31.80 for Seniors (Seniors are anyone over 65) These rates will be reflected on the utility bill you receive around 6/1/2019.

Sidewalks & Fire Hydrants

- It would be greatly appreciated if you could shovel off your sidewalks after it snows. We do have many individuals who walk around town and this would improve their safety.
- Also if you have a fire hydrant in your yard please try to keep it clear of snow. This will help the Fire Department if there is a fire and the hydrant needs to be used.
